LESSON PLAN

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

The students will learn about

- functions of a family
- types of families
- family tree

TEACHING AIDS

A chart showing small and big families, blackboard, chalk, duster and digital content.

TEACHING STRATEGY

- The students will paste photographs of their families in their Warm Up activity. After they have done the Warm Up activity, ask them about their families.
- Ask them if they have twins in their families or in the families known to them.
- Ask about the different customs followed in their families.
- Ask the students in-text questions and let them answer orally.
- Tell about the qualities of an ideal family.
- Sum up the chapter by going through the points under the head 'Remember'.
- Finally, help the students do all the exercises.

BOOST UP

- Show animations of small families/big families to the students or show a chart depicting pictures of small/big families.
- Explain the concept of a family tree by drawing a diagram on the blackboard.

EXPECTED LEARNING OUTCOMES
