



LESSON PLAN

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

The students will learn

- ▶ how people in olden times travelled
- ▶ about land, air and water transport
- ▶ what a level crossing is
- ▶ about animals used as means of transport
- ▶ about air and noise pollution

TEACHING AIDS

A chart showing different means of transport, blackboard, chalk, duster and digital content.

TEACHING STRATEGY

- ▶ Point out that a special type of vehicle is shown in Warm Up.
- ▶ Talk about the invention of the wheel.
- ▶ Give examples of different means of transport such as land, water and air.
- ▶ Talk about the metro trains.
- ▶ Explain what a level crossing is.
- ▶ Give examples of animals that are used as means of transport.
- ▶ Tell that an aeroplane is the fastest means of transport.
- ▶ Explain air pollution and noise pollution.
- ▶ Sum up the chapter by going through the points under the head 'Remember'.
- ▶ Finally, help the students do all the exercises.

BOOST UP

- ▶ Show pictures/animations of the digital content.
- ▶ If there is a railway museum near your school, the students can be taken there.

EXPECTED LEARNING OUTCOMES

The students are able to learn about

- ▶ different types of transport

- ▶ level crossing
- ▶ animals used in transport
- ▶ side-effects of air and noise pollution.

EVALUATIVE QUESTIONS

The teachers may ask the following questions to evaluate their students.

1. How metro trains are useful?
2. Why should we use public transport more often?
