Mapping Our Neighbourhood

LESSON PLAN

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

The students will be able to learn about

- what a sketch is
- what a landmark is
- directions
- what a map is
- the language of maps

TEACHING AIDS

▶ A wall map, blackboard, chalk, duster and digital content.

TEACHING STRATEGY

- After the students have done the Warm Up activity, discuss about the neighbourhood services.
- Give an example and tell the students to draw a sketch.
- ▶ Point out the importance of a landmark in locating a place.
- Show the wall map and point out the directions on the map.
- ▶ Tell about the language of a map.
- Explain the scale of map.
- ▶ Tell about the colours used in maps and their significance.

BOOST UP

- Explain the importance of legend in a map.
- ▶ Sum up the chapter by going through the points under the head 'Remember'.
- Finally, help the students do all the exercises.

EXPECTED LEARNING OUTCOMES

- language of maps.
- scale of a map.
