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Fun and Play

LESSON PLAN

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

The students will be able to learn about

- the importance of fun and play in our lives
- the difference between indoor and outdoor games
- harmful effects of video games
- importance of rules in a game
- ways to have fun at fair and circus

TEACHING AIDS

A chart showing indoor and outdoor games, blackboard, chalk, duster and digital content.

TEACHING STRATEGY

- ▶ Help the students do the Warm Up activity as they may not be familiar with all the sportspersons.
- Ask the students to name a few indoor and outdoor games.
- Highlight the fact that playing outdoors is a great way to keep healthy and fit.
- Emphasise that playing video games is not good for our eyes.
- ▶ Tell about the rules followed in some popular games like football and cricket. Highlight that without rules, games cannot be played in a fair manner.
- Ask the students to narrate their experience at a fair or circus.
- Sum up the chapter by going through the points given under the head 'Remember'.
- Finally, help the students do all the exercises.

BOOST UP

- ▶ Show pictures/animations of indoor/outdoor games.
- ▶ Show pictures/ animations of a fair or circus.

EXPECTED LEARNING OUTCOMES

- indoor games and outdoor games.
- harmful effects of video games.

- events that take place in a fair.
- people who perform in a circus.
