LESSON PLAN

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

The students will be able to learn about

- why animals move in groups
- how birds help the animals
- where bees live
- how honey is made

TEACHING AIDS

Blackboard, chalk, duster and digital content.

TEACHING STRATEGY

- Help the students to do the Warm Up activity.
- Explain why animals move in groups.
- Tell the students not to tease or hurt animals.
- Show the picture of cattle egret, oxpecker and Egyptian plover to the students.
- Explain how honeybees make honey.
- Tell the benefits of honey.
- Sum up the chapter by going through the points under the title 'Remember'.
- Finally, help this students do all the exercises.

BOOST UP

- Show pictures/animations of groups of animals.
- Show picture of a beehive.
