

LESSON PLAN

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

The students will learn about

- parts into which an insect's body is divided
- places where insects live
- worms, spiders, millipedes and centipedes

TEACHING AIDS

Blackboard, chalk, duster and digital content.

TEACHING STRATEGY

- ▶ After the students have done the Warm Up activity, tell about the three parts of an insect's body head, middle part and abdomen.
- ▶ Tell that all insects have six legs.
- Ask the students to name some common insects found in their homes.
- ▶ Tell the places where insects are generally found.
- Explain that a spider is not an insect because it does not have six legs.
- Explain what a worm is.
- ▶ Sum up the chapter by going through the points under the head 'Remember'.
- ▶ Help the students do all the exercises.

BOOST UP

- Show pictures/animations of insects.
- Show a web of a spider to the students.

EXPECTED LEARNING OUTCOMES

The students are able to learn about

- parts of an insect's body
- places where insects live

EVALUATIVE QUESTIONS

The teachers may ask the following questions to evaluate the students.

- 1. Why are mosquitoes harmful?
- 2. Why should we not eat uncovered food?
