



LESSON PLAN

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

The students will be able to learn about

- ▶ how bricks are made
- ▶ what a kiln is
- ▶ what a bridge is
- ▶ types of bridges

TEACHING AIDS

- ▶ A chart showing different types of bridges, blackboard, chalk, duster and digital content.

TEACHING STRATEGY

- ▶ The students would love to do the Warm Up activity.
- ▶ Explain how a wall is made.
- ▶ Show picture/animation of a plumb line.
- ▶ Tell briefly about the history of bridges.
- ▶ Show photos/animations of different types of bridges.
- ▶ Sum up the chapter by going through the points under the head 'Remember'.
- ▶ Finally, help the students do all the exercises.

BOOST UP

- ▶ Bring clay in the class and demonstrate how a brick is made.
- ▶ Ask the students to paste pictures of five famous bridges of the world in their scrapbooks.

EXPECTED LEARNING OUTCOMES

- ▶ different types of bridges.

EVALUATIVE QUESTIONS

The teachers may ask the following questions to evaluate the students.
