

LESSON PLAN

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

The students will learn about

- senses of insects, birds and animals
- sleeping pattern of animals

TEACHING AIDS

Blackboard chalk, duster and digital content.

TEACHING STRATEGY

- Help the students do the Warm Up activity. Point out that dogs are very useful in helping the blind people.
- Explain how the sense organs are useful to the animals. For example, sharp sight of eagles and vultures helps them to locate a prey.
- Sharks can smell blood in water hundreds of metres away.
- Bats hear with the help of echoes.
- Insects like houseflies, bees, etc., have taste buds on their feet.
- Explain that different animals sleep for different hours.
- Sum up the chapter by going through the points under the head 'Remember'.
- Finally, help the students do all the exercises.

BOOST UP

Show picture/animation of how a bat flies with the help of echo location.
