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Protecting the Wildlife

LESSON PLAN

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

The students will learn about

- poachers
- extinct and endangered animals
- ▶ the Wildlife Protection Act (1972)

TEACHING AIDS

Blackboard, chalk, duster and digital content.

TEACHING STRATEGY

- Help the students do the Warm Up activity. Tell about the work the Worldwide Fund for Wildlife does.
- Explain how poachers are responsible for the killing of animals and their extinction.
- ▶ Tell about the Wildlife Protection Act of 1972.
- ▶ Tell about the functions of wildlife sanctuaries and national parks.
- ▶ Tell the names of some national parks and wildlife sanctuaries of our country.
- ▶ Sum up the chapter by going through the points under the head 'Remember'.
- Finally, help the students do all the exercises.

BOOST UP

- Show a map of wildlife sanctuaries and national parks to the students.
- Ask the students to make a list of ten animals which have become extinct.
