Communication

- Sending and receiving messages and information.
- Contact with relatives and friends personal communication letters, telephone, fax and e-mail.

Means of Personal Communication

- ▶ Post Office Courier Speed Post Largest postal service in the world in India.
- ▶ <u>SMS</u> Short Message Service ; message instantly sent fax.
- ▶ Telephone and mobile phone popular
- Smartphones and their uses send and receive calls and messages; listen to music; surf Internet; take photographs; record videos; send and receive e-mails; use different apps.

Means of Mass Communication

- ▶ For contacting a large number of people at one time.
- Newspapers, magazines, radio, television audio-visual means widespread messages and information and can be repeated.
- Radio and TV broadcast news, educational, cultural and entertainment 'live' programmes – from every part of the world – TV popular.
- ▶ Man-made satellites high above earth long-distance communication
- Computers and smartphones internet useful for both personal and mass communication.
- <u>E-readers</u> to save and read e-books.
