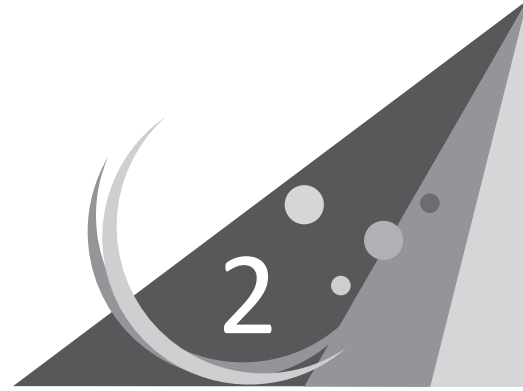


# India—Human Resources



## LESSON PLAN

### SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

- The students will learn about
- what human resources mean
  - distribution of population

### TEACHING AIDS

Chart papers, flashcards, a projector, blackboard, chalk, duster, pointer, etc.

### TEACHING STRATEGY

- Start with Warm Up.
- Tell the meaning of human resources.
- Explain the distribution of population in India in detail. Explain about the harmful effects of over population.
