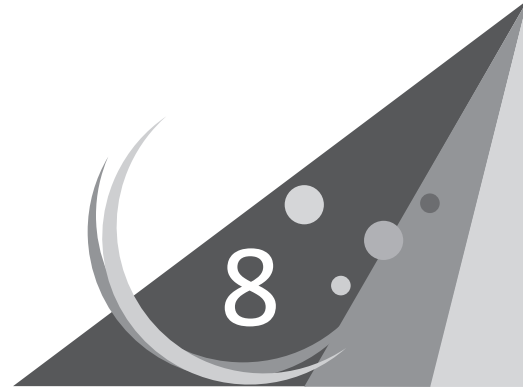


# India's Rich Heritage



## LESSON PLAN

### SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES
