LESSON PLAN

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

The students will learn about

- himself/herself
- their school
- their friends
- their likes and dislikes

TEACHING AIDS

Photographs related to the lesson, blackboard, chalk, duster, etc.

TEACHING STRATEGY

- The teacher may ask a student to read the opening lines.
- The teacher may assume the role of a student and may introduce himself/herself to the students.
- The teacher, then, will call other students one by one and ask them to introduce themselves.
- The sentence, 'My best friend is _____' should not be discussed openly in the class. The teacher, rather, may ask the students to write the answer of this question in their notebook.
- The teacher may advise the students to eat all types of food, except junk food. He/She may show pictures of fruits, vegetables, eggs, fishes, meat, etc.
- The teacher, then, may advise the students to take part in outdoor games like football, cricket, hockey, etc.
- The teacher should advise the students to read different types of books.

BOOST UP

- To make the lesson interesting, the teacher may show photographs related to the topics.
- The teacher may read stories from different storybooks.
- The teacher may show pictures of different famous sports personalities to create an interest in games and sports among the students.
- Then, the teacher will ask the students to solve the exercises to evaluate their understanding.

The teacher may ask the following questions to evaluate their students.
