

LESSON PLAN

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

The students will learn about

- our helpers
- why we need the help of those people
- how to respect our helpers

TEACHING AIDS

A labelled chart paper containing pictures of different people who help us, models, a projector, blackboard, chalk, duster, pointer, etc.

TEACHING STRATEGY

- First, the teacher will ask the students to solve the exercise given in Warm Up. The exercise will give the students insight into the lesson.
- The teacher, then, will tell the students about who our helpers are and why we need help of those people.
- Then, the teacher will tell about the helpers referred in the lesson. He/She should tell a little about the equipment of each helper.

BOOST UP

- The teacher may include some more persons like driver, rickshaw puller, salespersons at shops, etc., in the discussion.
- The teacher may ask the students to name more helpers.
- The teacher, then, will ask the students to solve the exercise to evaluate their understanding.
- The teacher may initiate a discussion on the topic given in Think and Answer.

EXPECTED LEARNING OUTCOMES

The students are able to learn

- about who our helpers are
- the need of help from our helpers
- about different helpers

EVALUATIVE QUESTIONS

The teacher may ask the following questions to evaluate the students.

- **1.** Name a few people who help us.
- 2. Why do we need help from our helpers?
- 3. What does an electrician do?
- 4. What does a farmer do?
- 5. How does a mason help us?
