

LESSON PLAN

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

The students

- learn about, what a festival is
- learn about Diwali
- learn about Holi
- learn about Eid
- learn about Gurupurab
- learn about Christmas
- learn about Onam
- learn about Republic Day
- learn about Independence Day
- learn about Gandhi Jayanti

TEACHING AIDS

A chart containing pictures of different festivals, models, flashcards, posters, blackboard, chalk, duster, projector, pointer, etc.

TEACHING STRATEGY

- The teacher will start with the Warm Up. He/She will describe the pictures.
- The teacher, then, will describe the festivals one-by-one. First, he/she will describe Diwali.
- Then, he/she will describe Holi—how people celebrate it. He/She should tell the students to play safe holi.
- The teacher, then, will describe Eid.
- The teacher will tell about Gurupurab. The teacher should tell about 'langar', the community kitchen.
- The teacher, then, will tell about, Christmas and its celebration.
- He/She, then, will tell about Onam. The teacher will tell in detail about celebrations of the festival.
- The teacher, then, will tell about Republic Day, Independence Day and Gandhi Jayanti in detail.

BOOST UP

- To make the lesson more interesting, the teacher may tell related stories and legends.
- He/she may show slide show on different festivals celebrated in different parts of the country.
- The teacher will ask the students to solve the exercises.
- He/She will initiate a discussion on the topic given in Think and Answer.

EXPECTED LEARNING OUTCOMES
