LESSON PLAN

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

The students learn that

- animals too need homes to live
- domestic animals and pets live in the houses built by us
- some wild animals build their own homes
- some wild animals do not make homes

TEACHING AIDS

A chart paper containing pictures of different animals and their homes, flashcards, a projector, blackboard, chalk, duster, etc.

TEACHING STRATEGY

- The teacher will start with the 'Warm Up' given at the beginning of the lesson. The teacher should give a little introduction on the activity stated here.
- Then, the teacher will tell the students that animals too need homes. He/She may ask the students the need of a home for them and the outcome can be applied to the animals too.
- The teacher, then, will tell that we build homes for pets and domestic animals.
- The teacher, then, will tell the students about the houses where different animals live.

BOOST UP

- The teacher may show a slideshow.
- The teacher may show some video clippings from Animal Planet.
- The teacher should tell the students not to destroy any nest/home of any animal.
- The teacher will ask the students to solve the exercises to evaluate them.
- While discussing the topic given in Think and Answer, the teacher may advise the students to observe/study an abandoned nest.

EXPECTED LEARNING OUTCOMES

The students are able to learn

- that an animal needs a home to live
- that domestic animals and pets live in the homes build by us

- that some animals build their own house

EVALUATIVE QUESTIONS

The teacher may ask the following questions to evaluate his/her students.

1. Name an animal that does not build a home.
2. Who lives in the nest?
3. Who lives in the burrow?
4. Who lives in a coop?
5. Who lives in the hole?
