## LESSON PLAN

### SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

The students will learn about

- India
- central government
- state governments
- union territories

### TEACHING AIDS

- Chart papers, maps, pointer, blackboard, chalk, duster, etc.

### TEACHING STRATEGY

- First, the teacher will start with Warm Up. He/She will ask the students to colour the national flag correctly.
- Then the teacher will tell about India.
- Then the teacher will tell about the central government.
- Then the teacher will tell about state governments.
- Then the teacher will tell about union territories.

- The teacher may show charts.
