- Tell about wheels and transport of early humans.
- Tell about discovery of metals by early humans.
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BOOST UP

- The teacher may show charts.
- The teacher may show flashcards on different topics.
- The teacher may show maps regarding early settlements of early humans.
- The teacher may show pictures of cave paintings.
- Initiate a discussion on the topic given in Think and Answer.
