Charles Dickens was a famous English novelist, known for his iconic works such as 'Oliver Twist', 'A Christmas Carol' and 'Great Expectations'.

Charles Dickens was born on 7 February 1812, in Portsmouth, England. He was the second of eight children, and his father was a clerk in the Navy Pay Office. When Charles was 12 years old, his father was imprisoned for debt, and Charles had to leave school and work in a shoe-blacking factory to help support his family.

Despite his difficult childhood, Charles showed an early talent for writing. He began his career as a journalist and later published his first novel, 'The Pickwick Papers', in 1836. He went on to write many more novels and became one of the most popular and successful writers of his time.

In 1836, Charles married Catherine Hogarth, with whom he had ten children. However, their marriage was not a happy one, and they separated in 1858. Charles later fell in love with Ellen Ternan, an actress, and they lived together until his death.

In his later years, Charles's health began to decline, and he suffered from several illnesses, including gout and a stroke. He died on 9 June 1870, at the age of 58, leaving behind a legacy as one of the greatest writers in English literature.


