Lesson Plan

- Teacher will start the chapter with 'Gear Up' section explaining how a work can be done easily.

- Teacher will explain importance of friction and its uses in everyday life.
- Teacher will explain the harmful effects of friction.
- Teacher will discuss the methods to reduce friction.
- Teacher will ask students to solve 'Check Point'.
- At last, teacher will sum up the chapter by going through all the points given under the head 'Wrap up now' and revising the 'New Words'.
- Finally, teacher will help students to solve all the exercises given under the head 'Practice Time'.
