The Great Banyan is a tree located in Acharya Jagadish Bose Indian Botanic Garden, Howrah, near Kolkata. It is over 250 years old. It is also mentioned in the travel books of the nineteenth century. The tree was damaged by two great cyclones in 1884 and 1886. Many of its branches were broken and exposed to the attack of a fungus then.

The Great Banyan tree looks like a forest rather than an individual tree. The main trunk of the tree decayed and so it was removed in 1925. The tree now lives without its main trunk. The tree is spread over 14,500 square metres. The present crown of the tree has a circumference of about 1 kilometre and its highest branch rises to about 25 metres. It has about 3,300 aerial roots reaching down to the ground from its branches and stem.
