Food and Homes of Animals

LESSON PLAN

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

The students will learn about

- ✧ food of animals
- ✧ homes of animals

TEACHING AIDS

Pictures/charts/models/animations on plant-eating animals; fruit and grain-eating animals; flesh-eating animals; plant and flesh-eating animals; insect-eating animals; homes of different wild and domestic animals and birds (all as given in chapter)

LESSON PLAN

- ✧ Teacher will start the chapter with 'Gear Up' section by asking some simple questions on animals' homes and the food they eat, based on the previous knowledge of students.
- ✧ Teacher will tell the importance of food for living beings.
- ✧ Now, with the help of teaching aids, teacher will explain that animals eat different types of food and based on the food they eat, they are of many types (as described in chapter).
- ✧ Now, to evaluate the understanding of students, teacher will ask them to solve 'Check Point 1'.
- ✧ Now, teacher will explain that animals also need home to live in and some wild animals do not need home, they roam around in the forest.
- ✧ Teacher will also tell that domestic and pet animals live in houses made by us.
- ✧ Now, with the help of teaching aids, teacher will explain and give the names of living places of different wild, domestic and pet animals (as described in chapter).
- ✧ Now, teacher will ask students to solve 'Check Point 2'.
- ✧ At last, teacher will sum up the lesson by going through the points given under the head 'Wrap up now'.
- ✧ Teacher will help students to answer the questions given under the head 'Practice Time'.

BOOST UP

Teacher can encourage students to observe their own food, the different types of food animals eat and the houses or places where they live in.

EXPECTED LEARNING OUTCOMES

The students understand and know that

- ✧ animals eat different types of food.
- ✧ animals also need home to live in.
- ✧ some wild animals make their homes themselves, whereas some do not need home.
- ✧ domestic and pet animals do not make their homes but they live in the homes made by us.

EVALUATIVE QUESTIONS

The teacher may ask the following questions for evaluating learning and understanding of students:

1. Name some plant-eating animals.
2. What do hen, squirrel and parrot eat?
3. What does a lion eat?
4. What does a peacock eat?
5. What do lizards and sparrows eat?
6. Which animals do not have homes?
7. Where is a dog kept?
8. Where do bees live?
