Mowgli Finds his Family

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

- > Understanding the love that animals have for humans
- > Reading, listening and understanding the lesson
- > Answering questions orally and in writing
- > Vocabulary–Words, meanings, spellings, pronunciation, writing sentences about endangered animals
- > Grammar-Articles and their usage
- > Learning to converse

Warm Up

- * Ask the students to match animals with their descriptions.
- * Tell about the characteristics of some more animals.

Outcome: Knowing more facts about animals.

Read and Enjoy

- * Ask the students to read aloud the lesson in turns.
- * Correct their pronunciation.
- * Explain the lesson.
- * Ask questions like: Have you read 'The Jungle Book'? Have you seen the Doordarshan serial Mowgli on TV? Do animals have feelings?

Outcome: Read aloud, listen and understand words, meanings, spellings and pronunciation.

Read and Understand

- * Let the students do Exercises A and B on their own. Announce the correct answers and the students can check their answers.
- * Discuss Exercises C and D. Write the correct answers on the blackboard after discussion. The students can transcribe their answers in their notebooks.
- * Think and Answer–Discuss Exercise E. Point out the consequences of borrowing. Then, let the students write their answers.

Outcome: Reading and understanding and answering questions orally and in writing.

Grammar is Fun

- * Using the blackboard and given examples explain determiners.
- * Discuss Exercises F, G and H. Then, the students can do this on their own.
- * Announce the correct answers aloud and the students can correct them in pairs.

Outcome: Articles and their usage.

Word Power

- * Let the students do Exercise I on their own.
- * Announce the correct answers and the students can check their answers.

Outcome: Enhancement of one's general awareness.

Let's Listen

- * Read the riddles.
- * Ask the solutions for these riddles.

Outcome: Listening attentively, understanding and answering questions.

Let's Converse

- * Let two students enact the roles of Akhil and Rohan.
- * Let them enact the dialogues in the class.
- * The rest of the class can comment on the dialogue enactment, pronunciation, expression, etc.

Outcome: Listening attentively, understanding and answering questions.

Let's Speak

- * Pronounce the words. Let the students follow.
- * Correct their pronunciation.

Outcome: Pronouncing words in the correct way.

Writing Skills

- * Let the students gather information from the Internet.
- * Check and asses their work individually.

Outcome: Enhancement of writing skills.
