

Animals Around Us

LESSON PLAN

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

The students learn about

- animals—what animals are
- birds—what birds are
- homes of animals
- domestic animals
- wild animals

TEACHING AIDS

A chart paper containing pictures of different animals and birds, labelled pictures of wild and domestic animals, a projector, video clippings from the Animal Planet channel, blackboard, chalk, duster, etc.

TEACHING STRATEGY

- The teacher will start the lesson with 'Warm Up'. The students will circle the animal(s) as instructed.
- The teacher, then, will give a general introduction about animals.
- Then, the teacher will speak about the animals that live on land, in water and on trees.
- The teacher, then, will tell about birds with examples.
- Then, the teacher will tell about domestic and wild animals.

BOOST UP

- The teacher may show flashcards having pictures of different animals and birds and may ask the students where each animal lives.
- He/She may give some common information on the animals.
- The teacher may take the students to a zoo to show them wild animals or may ask them whether the students have visited a zoo. If any of the students has visited, the teacher may ask the student(s) to name and describe the animal(s) he/she has seen.

- The teacher may advise the students to watch Animal Planet to know unknown facts about animals.
- The teacher may use an audio-visual device to show the animals with their sounds.
- The teacher will explain the topics given under Knowledge Zone.
- The teacher, then, will ask the students to solve the exercises given in the book.
- The teacher should initiate a discussion on the topic given in HOTS. The teacher may tell that in many cultures, animals are treated as gods which shows that animals are given an important place in our life.

EXPECTED LEARNING OUTCOMES

The students are able

- to know about animals
- to know different types of animals
- to learn about domestic animals
- to learn about wild animals
- to love and take care of animals

EVALUATIVE QUESTIONS

The teacher may ask the following questions to evaluate his/her students.

1. Name three animals that live in water.
2. Name three animals that live on trees.
3. Name three birds.
4. What is a wild animal?
5. Name three domestic animals.
