LESSON PLAN

O Vocabulary—Words, meanings, spellings, pronunciation

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES Learning that recreation is as important as studying Playing keeps us healthy and fit Recognising things in a park

- O Grammar—Verbs and their usage
- O Learning to converse

WARM UP

- O Ask the students the games they like to play.
- O Talk to them about the benefits of playing outdoors.

Outcome: Playing in a park is a good form of recreation.

READING

- O Read aloud the lesson and ask the students to read in turns.
- O Correct their pronunciation.
- O Explain the lesson.

Outcome: Reading aloud, listening attentively, learning new words, spellings, pronunciation.

READ AND UNDERSTAND

- O Exercise A: Discuss each question with options. Let the students mark the correct options in the book.
- O Let the students do exercises B and C on their own in the class. Correct them if they are wrong.

Outcome: Understanding and answering the questions.

GRAMMAR IS FUN

- O Explain what verbs are using the blackboard and examples from classroom, school and home.
- O Exercises D and E can be done orally in the class. The students can write answers in their notebooks.

Outcome: Learning about verbs and their usage.

LET'S SPELL

O Ask students to select word from the given box and fill in the blanks with letters.

Outcome: Recalling words in the lesson, learning to spell.

WORD POWER

O Explain what opposite words are. Encourage the students to find the opposites.

Outcome: Learning opposites.

LET'S LISTEN

O Read the passage twice. Ask the students to listen to it carefully. Ask questions one at a time and ask the students to answer them orally.

Outcome: Listening attentively, understanding and answering the questions orally.

LET'S SPEAK

O Read the given words aloud, carefully differentiating the sound |x| and |x|

Outcome: Learning the difference in pronouncing |x| and |x|

LET'S CONVERSE

- O Let two students enact the conversation. Correct their pronunciation.
- O Correct the pronunciation, pauses, inflexions, etc.

Outcome: Learning how to talk, pronounce, pause, etc.

WRITING SKILLS

O Discuss the possible words that can be added to complete each sentence.

Outcome: Using suitable words to make complete sentences.

ACTIVITY/PROJECT

O Encourage the students to do colouring without anybody's help.

Outcome: Expressing individual creativity.
