SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

The students will learn about

- the location and extent of Prairies
- the physical features of Prairies
- the climatic conditions of Prairies

- the people living in Prairies

TEACHING AIDS

Chart papers, a projector, models, flashcards, globes, maps, blackboard, chalk, duster, pointer, etc.

TEACHING STRATEGY

- Tell about the location and extent of Prairies.
- Tell about the physical features of Prairies.
- Tell about the climatic conditions of Prairies.
- Tell about the natural vegetation and wildlife of Prairies.
- Tell about the economic activities in Prairies.
- Tell about the people living in Prairies.

BOOST UP

- The teacher may show chart papers.
- The teacher may show flashcards.
- The teacher may show photographs.
- The teacher will ask the students to solve the exercises in the lesson.
- The teacher may initiate a discussion on the topic given in Think and Answer.
- The teacher may initiate a discussion on the topic given in Value Corner.
