## LESSON PLAN

### SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

The students will learn about

- the European traders and trade with India
- the establishment of the British East India Company
- the rule of the British East India Company in India
- the Revolt of 1857
- the rise of nationalism

### TEACHING AIDS

Chart papers, flashcards, models, blackboard, duster, chalks, etc.

### TEACHING STRATEGY

- First, start with Warm Up. Ask the names of the persons in pictures.
- Tell about the European traders and trade with India.
- Tell about the establishment of the British East India Company.
- Tell about the rule of the British East India Company in India.
- Tell about the Revolt of 1857.
- Tell about the rise of nationalism.

### BOOST UP

- The teacher may show maps.
- The teacher may show photographs of different historical things.
- The teacher may arrange a tour to any nearby historical place.
- The teacher may arrange a tour to a museum.
- Then, the teacher will ask the students to solve the exercises given in the lesson.
- The teacher, then, will initiate a discussion on the topic given in Think and Answer.
