Fun at the Park

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

- > Learning that recreation is as important as studying
- > Playing keeps us healthy and fit
- > Recognising things in a park
- > Vocabulary–Words, meanings, spellings, pronunciation
- > Grammar-Describing words and their usage, knowing about punctuation
- > Learning to converse

Warm Up

- * Ask the students the games they like to play.
- * Talk to them about the benefits of playing outdoors.

Outcome: Playing in a park is a good form of recreation.

Read and Enjoy

- * Read aloud the lesson and ask the students to read in turns.
- * Correct their pronunciation.
- * Explain the lesson.

Outcome: Reading aloud, listening attentively, learning new words, spellings, pronunciation.

Read and Understand

- * Exercise A: Discuss each question with options. Let the students mark the correct options in the book.
- * Let the students do Exercises B and C on their own in the class. Correct them if they are wrong.

Outcome: Understanding and answering the questions.

Grammar is Fun

* Explain what describing words are using blackboard, examples from book, class, home, etc.

* Exercise D: Do orally in class and let the students underline the adjectives. Ask them which word is described.

Outcome: Adjectives and their usage.

Let's Spell

* Ask students to select word from the given box and fill in the blanks with letters.

Outcome: Knowing the things we learn at school.

Word Power

* Explain what opposite words are. Encourage the students to find the opposites.

* Ask the students to match the, things with their names.

Outcome: Learning opposites and matching things.

Let's Listen

* Read the passage twice. Ask the students to listen to it carefully. Ask questions one at a time and ask the students to answer them orally.

Outcome: Listening attentively, understanding and answering the questions orally.

Let's Speak

* Read the given words aloud, carefully differentiating the sound |a| and |c|

Outcome: Learning the difference in pronouncing |x| and |z|

Let's Converse

* Let two students enact the conversation. Correct their pronunciation.

* Correct the pronunciation, pauses, inflexions, etc.

Outcome: Learning how to talk, pronounce, pause, etc.

Writing Skills

* Discuss the possible words that can be added to complete each sentence.

Outcome: Knowing the things we learn at school.

Activity/Project

* Encourage the students to do colouring without anybody's help.

Outcome: Expressing individual creativity.
