

WARM UP

CHAPTER NOTES

- » SmartArt allows you to provide information in a more presentable form with the help of graphics rather than just using text. There are a number of styles available to choose from and use to illustrate many different types of ideas.
- » To insert a SmartArt graphic, from the Insert tab, select the SmartArt command in the Illustrations group.
- you can also add text by clicking the desired shape and then typing the required text. This works well if you only need to add text to a few shapes. However, for more complex SmartArt graphics, working in the task pane is often faster.
- » PowerPoint 2013 makes it easy to transform traditional bullet points into eye-catching SmartArt graphics. If you already have text on a slide, you can convert it to SmartArt.
- » You can also convert SmartArt back to text.
- » Whenever you select a SmartArt graphic, the Design and Format tabs will appear on the right side of the Ribbon.
- » From there, you can easily edit the style and layout of a SmartArt graphic.
- » PowerPoint also includes several SmartArt styles, which allow you quickly modify the look of your SmartArt.
- » To change the style, select the desired style from the SmartArt styles group.
- » You can make a chart in PowerPoint but if you have a lot of data to


represent in the form of chart, it is better to create your chart in Excel, and then copy it into your presentation.


