LESSON PLAN

This motivational poem tells us how a little kite is afraid to fly but later on it tries and is successful in reaching very high sky.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

- Reading, enjoying and reciting poetry
- Understanding the poem—it tells that if we try again and again, we can succeed
- Understanding and answering questions on it

READ AND ENJOY

- Read the poem aloud with correct pronunciation and rhythm. Students may recite in four groups.
- Explain the poem and its words and phrases, e.g., thrilled with pride, tranquil sky, etc.

Outcome: Read, recite and understand.

READ AND UNDERSTAND

- Let the students do Exercise A on their own. Announce the correct answers so that the students can check their answers.
- Discuss Exercise B. Discuss one question at a time. As the correct answer emerges, dictate it for students to write it down neatly in their books/notebooks.

Outcome: Answering questions on the poem.

ACTIVITY/PROJECT

- Make groups of two students each. Let each group do Exercise C. Guide them as regards to pronunciation, expression, etc.
- Exercise D [Think and Answer]: Make a specimen of the letter first. Let the students fill in the blanks.

Outcome: Expressing one's creativity.
