

# India—Our Motherland

## LESSON PLAN

### SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

The students will learn about India in detail.

### TEACHING AIDS

Chart papers, flashcards, a projector, blackboard, chalk, duster, pointer, etc.

### TEACHING STRATEGY

- Start with Warm Up. Ask the students to tick (✓) the correct map.
- Tell about India's location on the world map.
- Tell about the physical features of India in brief.
- Tell about the states and union territories of India.

### BOOST UP

- To make the lesson more interesting, the teacher may use chart papers.
- The teacher may show a political and a physical map of India to the students.
- The teacher may show a world map to show the location of India on the world map.
- The teacher will ask the students to solve the exercises given in the lesson.
- The teacher will initiate a discussion on the topic given in HOTS.

### EXPECTED LEARNING OUTCOMES

The students will be able to learn about India in detail.

### EVALUATIVE QUESTIONS

The teacher may ask the following questions to the students to evaluate them.

1. What is the position of India according to size?
2. Name the neighbouring countries of India.
3. Which country is separated by Palk Strait?
4. What is the name of the southernmost tip of the mainland of India?
