- O Tell about the preventive measures we can take against disasters.

BOOST UP

- O To make the lesson interesting, the teacher may show chart papers.
- O The teacher may show flashcards.
- O The teacher may take the students to a river bank to show water pollution.

- O The teacher will ask the students to solve the exercises in the lesson.
- O The teacher will initiate a discussion on the topic in the HOTS.
