LESSON PLAN

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

The students will learn about

- the environment
- air pollution, land pollution and water pollution
- ways to take care of the environment
- noise pollution
- some natural disasters (case study)

TEACHING AIDS

Chart papers, flashcards, models, blackboard, duster, chalks, etc.

TEACHING STRATEGY

- First, start with Warm Up. The exercise will introduce the theme to the students.
- Tell about environment—natural and man-made.
- Tell about how our environment gets polluted.
- Tell about air pollution in detail.
- Tell about land pollution in detail.
- Tell about water pollution in detail.
- Tell about noise pollution in detail.
- Tell about the ways to take care of environment.
- Tell about a few natural disasters that occurred in India in the past.
- Tell about the preventive measures we can take against disasters.

BOOST UP

- To make the lesson interesting, the teacher may show chart papers.
- The teacher may show flashcards.
- The teacher may take the students to a river bank to show water pollution.

- The teacher will ask the students to solve the exercises in the lesson.
- The teacher will initiate a discussion on the topic in the HOTS.

EXPECTED LEARNING OUTCOMES
