# 9. Dhyan Chand— The Hockey Wizard



#### **COMPREHENSION**

Famous as a sarod maestro, Ustad Allauddin Khan was, in fact, a multi-faceted instrumentalist and among the greatest musicians India ever had. Fondly called Baba, he was the father of Ali Akbar Khan, a renowned sarod maestro too, and Annapurna Devi, his reclusive multi-talented daughter. He was guru to many Indian musical stalwarts like Ravi Shankar, Nikhil Banerjee, Indranil Bhattacharya, Pannalal Ghosh, Wazir Khan and many others.

He was the son of Sabdar Hossain Khan and was born in 1862 at Shibpur village in Brahmanbaria in what is today Bangladesh. His brother, Fakir Aftabuddin, first introduced him to music at home. But suddenly at the age of 10, Allauddin Khan left home to work in traditional Jatra theatre, thus learning about the rich Bengali folk art. Later, he reached Kolkata where singer Gopal Krishna Bhattacharya took him under his tutelage for 12 years. His guru after that was Amritlal Dutt, a kin of Swami Vivekananda. Simultaneously, Khan also learnt the European classical violin.

At a show hosted by the *zamindar* of Muktagachha, Allauddin heard the sarod played by a disciple of Asghar Ali Khan. It was a love that lasted a lifetime. He began learning the instrument from Asghar Ali Khan. After five years, he went on to Rampur to take lesson from Wazir Khan Beenkar, court musician of the Nawab and a descendant of the legendary Tansen. Thus, Allauddin Khan entered the illustrious Senia gharana of Hindustani Classical music.

Allauddin Khan went on to become the court musician of Brijnath Singh, Maharaja of Maihar in the Central Provinces. He completely revamped the Maihar Gharana of classical music making significant changes in it. He set up the Maihar college of Music in 1955. He received the Sangeet Natak Akademi Award (1952), the Padma Bhushan (1958) and the Padma Vibhushan (1971) in recognition of his achievements in the field of music.
