

## **A Unique Party**

## **LEARNING OBJECTIVES**

- Learning about the enjoyment of reading books, listening to poetry and nursery rhymes, becoming familiar with the characters and their stories.
- Listening, reading and understanding and answering the questions orally and in writing.
- → Grammar Learning about Adjectives and their types. Comparison of Adjectives. The three degrees of comparison - Positive, Comparative, Superlative.
- Rearranging letters to form meaningful words; words that tell us professions, pronunciation practice, writing a letter; dictionary skills.
- Learning to speak and converse correctly.
- **Outcome:** Learning to enjoy end appreciate the value of reading and listening to rhymes and stories.
- Learning how to do punctuation properly.
- Speaking and writing correctly.

0000	Talk about what makes you happy – a party at home or anything else. Ask the students what they do when there is a party at home. Do they celebrate or help family members to arrange for the party? Ask them and explain what a theme party is and how it is done. Ask students to do this exercise on their own.	Get Set!
Э	Read the lesson aloud and ask the students to be the characters from the play.	Read and Enjoy
3	Explain the words and their meanings. Reading creates familiarisation with words.	
3	Focus on the central idea of the story: How knowledge of books/ poetry/stories can expand your circle of friends and make life more interesting, creative and fun.	
3	Discuss the questions in Exercises A, B, C, and D and ask the students to answer them orally first.	Read and Understand
Э	Wherever necessary, write answers on the board to help them in answering questions on the text, whether oral or written.	
Э	They can then write the answers of Exercises A-D.	
3	Exercise A: Read and discuss the question in class. Then ask the students to write down the answers. The teacher must check the answers of each student individually.	Think and Answer
3	Use the board to explain what Adjectives are and their kinds with the help of the examples.	Grammar Spotlight

	3	Tell them how adjectives are not only used in comparisons but also to show possession. Give examples to explain.
