<b>Read and Enjoy</b>	<p>➤ Read aloud the poem by Madhulika Singh first, explaining it clearly, stanza by stanza. It talks about the poet as a little girl who is happy at home.</p>
<b>Read and Understand</b>	<p>➤ A. Read out and explain the exercise. Do it orally first, asking the students to select the correct words. Then ask them to write the correct answer in their books.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Stanza 1</b> : There are many houses around, some bigger and better, but the girl loves her own home.</li> <li>• <b>Stanza 2</b> : She loves it because it is the place where she is free to laugh, jump, play and dance, and do all the things she loves and enjoys.</li> <li>• <b>Stanza 3</b> : Everyone in her family knows her and loves her so much that when she feels ill or unwell, they know it immediately just by looking at her.</li> <li>• <b>Stanza 4</b> : She is hugged with love and surrounded with care and within a day she gets well.</li> <li>• <b>Stanza 5</b> : She says it takes a sweet home to make it a happy place for everyone.</li> </ul> <p>➤ Ask questions about how the students keep themselves happy in their own homes.</p>
<b>Appreciating the Poem</b>	<p>➤ A. Explain what are rhyming words, using the examples and your own. Example: so-go; car-far; gate-late; last-past; more-sore; kite-light; cat-sat; ball-all; back-sack; etc. Then read and explain the exercise. Do the exercise orally first, using the board if required, and then ask the students to write the correct answers in their books.</p>
