ວ ວ ວ	This poem, from 'A Child's Garden of Verses', is by Robert Louis Stevenson who wrote a lot of poems, stories and novels about children and older people and their lives. He wrote 'Treasure Island', 'Kidnapped', 'The Strange Case of Dr Jekyll and Mr Hyde', etc. This poem describes how the poet and his friend Tom have spent a thoroughly enjoyable afternoon ['till tea'] playing a game on the stairs. They imagined they were sailors at sea and created a ship out of chairs, pillows as billowing waves and water in a bucket to represent the sea water! They even had some food for their journey – an apple and a slice of cake. It was great fun, though Tom tumbled down and hurt his knee. Read aloud and enjoy the rhythm, rhyme and meaning of the poem.	Read and Enjoy
Э	Explain the poem clearly to the students so that they understand how the poet [as a little boy] enjoyed his imaginary sailing adventure. Ask them to learn the poem and recite it correctly in turns in the class. Correct them where necessary.
