	which are created to ensure the rhyme and the rhythm of the poem.	
Э	Explain the literal meanings and, where required, the imagined	
	meanings of lines and phrases like 'castles of the foam', 'past the mill'.	
Э	Discuss the exercises and ask the students to answer them orally,	
	before writing the answers down.	
Э	Ask them to learn the poem and recite it correctly in turns in the class.
