LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- Exploring the mischievous and humorous behaviour described in the poem.
- Understanding the idea of shared responsibility and avoiding blame.
- Reading and reciting the poem with correct rhythm and expression.
- Answering questions about the poem's content and meaning.
- Learning new words, their meanings, spellings and rhymes.
- **Outcome:** Understanding the poem's message about human nature.
- Learning to recite the poem fluently and expressively.
- Appreciating the humorous portrayal of everyday situations.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Read aloud the poem to enjoy its rhythm, rhyme and humour. ➤ Explain the poem's theme of blaming an imaginary person for little mishaps. ➤ Discuss the character of 'Mr Nobody' and his funny habits, such as breaking things or making noise. ➤ Explain phrases like 'pulls the buttons from our shirts' and 'leaves the door ajar' to show how 'Mr Nobody' represents us all. ➤ Discuss the exercises and encourage students to answer orally before writing them. ➤ Ask students to memorise the poem and recite it in class, helping them improve their pronunciation and rhythm. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Explain the meaning and use of simile, especially in poetry. ➤ Give examples from everyday life that the students can relate to. Encourage them to give examples of their own too. ➤ Then, let them do the exercise on their own. ➤ Announce the answer or write it on the board and the students can check their work. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Explain Exercise A and then let the students do it on their own. ➤ Announce the answers and the students can check their own work. ➤ Exercise A: Explain the exercise and then let the students do it on their own.
