Summarize the message: "Watching TV is fun sometimes, but books

Encourage students to read a book at home and share what they read.

	(These stanzas describe how children become glued to the TV and forget to play or think.)	
Э	Activity: Act out being "glued" to a TV—freeze in a watching pose!	
Э	Ask: "What else can we do instead of watching TV?" (List ideas: reading,	
	playing outside, drawing, etc.)	
Э	Stanza 4	
	"It rots the sense in the head!	
	It kills imagination dead!"	
3	Activity: Explain what "rots" and "imagination" mean in simple terms.	
9	Draw a picture of a happy brain reading a book vs. a "sleepy" brain	
၁	watching TV. Stanza 5-6	
3	(The poet describes how parents replaced TV with books, and children rediscovered reading.) Activity: Show different types of storybooks.	
၁	Ask each child to name their favorite book.	
၁	Read a short story together.
