# **LESSON PLAN**

#### SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

The students will learn about

- ▶ the people who help us in many ways
- ▶ the people of different professions

#### **TEACHING AIDS**

A chart paper containing pictures of people at work, posters, blackboard, chalk, duster, pointer, projector, etc.

### **TEACHING STRATEGY**

- ▶ The teacher will start with the rhyme, 'Cobbler, Cobbler' given in 'Warm Up'. He/She may ask the students to recite the rhyme with actions. He/She, then, will explain the meaning of the rhyme.
- ▶ The teacher, then, will describe the people referred in the book.
- ▶ The teacher should advise the students to respect all the people who help us through different professions.
- The teacher may tell the students that we are able to lead a comfortable life because of these people.

#### **BOOST UP**

- ▶ To make the lesson interesting, the teacher can use a projector or a chart paper.
- ▶ The teacher can show the pictures of different tools used by people of different professions.
- ▶ The teacher may ask the students to recite with actions the following rhyme:

Chop, chop, choppity chop

I am a woodcutter.

Tap, tap, tappity tap

I am a cobbler.

Wash, wash, washity wash

I am washerman.

Snip, snip, snippity snip

I am a tailor

Dance, dance, dancity dance I am a dancer. March, march, marchity march I am a soldier.

Left-right, left-right

Off we go.

- The teacher should explain the above poem and he/she too can give some more examples on his/her own.
- ▶ The teacher, then, will ask the students to solve the exercises given in the book.

### **EXPECTED LEARNING OUTCOMES**

The students are able to learn

- about different professions
- the services that we get from different persons
- to respect people of different professions
