LEARNING OUTCOMES

- ▶ Learning to be well-behaved, helpful, kind and polite.
- ▶ Learning about dealing with naughty people.

Warm Up	♦ Discuss good and helpful behaviour.
	♦ Discuss – Do the students think it is necessary to be helpful and polite?
	♦ How do they deal with friends, neighbours or classmates who are naughty?
	 Discuss the pictures and ask the students to respond – how do they behave at home, in class, in school, on the road and in public places? You can ask the students what they themselves admire.
Dood and Enjoy	♦ Read the lesson aloud and then ask the students to read in turns.
Read and Enjoy	
	♦ Explain the meaning of words like complain, etc.
	♦ Correct their intonation, stress, pronunciation, etc.
	♦ Talk about the advantages of good and helpful behaviour—when in public and when alone.
	♦ Relate this to their own lives and ask in-text questions: How do they behave with their parents and siblings? Are they well-behaved or naughty? etc.
Read and	Discuss the questions in Exercises A, B, C and D and ask the students to answer orally.
Understand	 Then, where necessary, write the questions on the board to help the students in answering questions, whether oral or written.
Grammar Spot	⇒ Explain what adverbs are – words that tell us more about the action words overbs and their usage, with the instructions and examples given. Add your owr examples too, like quickly, readily, slowly, kindly, neatly, etc. Often we add '-ly to the action word to make it an adverb.
	Exercise A: Do the exercise orally first. Then ask the students to write the answers. Announce the answers aloud and let the students check their worl on their own or in pairs.
Spell Well	♦ Recognising the words learnt in the lesson.
	♦ Ask the students to do the exercise on their own.
	♦ Then do it on the board and let each one check his/her own work.
	Sometimes, ask them to find a meaning from the dictionary so that they continue to use this important reference book.

	*	Do Exercise A orally first and then ask the students to write it down.
	♦	Do the exercise on the board, eliminating the letters that can be added to form the words and then ask the students to complete the words. Then they can write the exercise in their notebooks.

	\$	Check the students where necessary.

	\$	Check if the students understand the conversation well by asking them a few questions; explain where necessary.
	\$	Correct the students regarding the content and pronunciation.
	\$	Encourage students to express their interests, etc., clearly.
Speak and Express	\$	Ask the students to speak about what they do on weekends.
	\$	Be non-judgemental—all recreational activities, family time is acceptable.
	\$	Ask the students to use descriptive words for the activities they describe—interesting, funny, helpful, loving, difficult, etc.
	\$	Teach them to put their thoughts into words correctly and politely and to
	\$	speak, so as to be understood clearly. This will teach them to be observant and to speak out their minds freely.
Pronunciation	\$	Let the students listen to the Digital Content so that they are sure of the right
Practice	\$	way to say the words. Let the students say aloud more words spelt with 'a'.
	*	In explaining the correct pronunciation, show how these words spelt with 'a' are different from what has been learnt earlier: cat; harm; air, etc.
	\$	Draw attention to the phonetic symbols, as you teach them the pronunciation.
Write Well	\$	Let the students do the exercise on their own.
	\$	Write the answers on the board so that each student can check his/her answer.
AIL Activity	\$	Let the students make patterns on the pot.
Values and Life Skills	\$	Read aloud the sentence and discuss it.
	*	It is important that you explain why it is necessary to do things for people who cannot repay you. Not all the actions in life are to be treated as 'deals'. It is good for them to understand this valuable lesson early. Giving brings its own joy and reward.
	*	Read aloud the question and all the given options.
	\$	Discuss each of the options.
	\$	Explain why option (b) is acceptable.
