Dr Rajendra Prasad was born in Ziradei, Siwan, Bihar on 3 December 1884. He was the youngest child in the family and was greatly loved by everyone.

He was deeply attached to his mother and elder brother, Mahendra. He was a brilliant student and was awarded a monthly scholarship of ₹30. He stood first in the entrance examination to the University of Calcutta and joined the famous Calcutta Presidency College in 1902.

Dr Rajendra Prasad was an accomplished lawyer. However, he realised that it would be only a matter of time before he would be caught up in the turmoil of the fight for independence. Though not initially impressed by Gandhiji's appearance, he was greatly moved by his dedication, conviction and courage that he showed in his fight against the British. He decided that he would help Gandhiji no matter what came his way.

Gandhiji's views greatly altered many of his views, most significantly on caste and untouchability. Dr Rajendra Prasad led a simple life and performed all tasks on his own, such as sweeping the floor and washing his own utensils. After India attained independence in 1947, he was elected the first President of Independent India on 26 January 1950.
