As the water poured on to the building, the smoke billows continued, but the flames began to subside.

The crowd around me was not quiet either. People had hustled about and woken up doctors and others in the colony. Many people had lined up their cars to take injured people to hospitals. Some had brought blankets, medicines and packets of food. Our neighbour had set up a 'tea shop' on a table nearby and had quickly organised hot tea for the firemen, the rescued people and for anyone else who needed it. The building was gutted. It would have to be demolished and reconstructed. But the courage of the firemen and the love and cooperation of all the people in our colony was so wonderful. The fire had built a great bond between all of us.
